Vinyl Dye has a special ability to 'seep into' plastic that other sprays such as paint can't do. As such Vinyl Dye can even flex with the plastic.

Furthermore, Vinyl Dye is UV resistant, so won't fade in direct sunlight quickly like many paints, and is completely waterproof.

Did you know if you spray the inside of a cardboard box with Vinyl Dye, it will hold the water for weeks? And so yes, many people use Vinyl Dye Sprays to restore folding roofs on vehicles too.

## HOW TO USE VINYL DYE

Step by step use of Vinyl Dye Sprays from [www.VinylDye.co.uk](http://www.VinylDye.co.uk) for Car, Van and Truck bumpers, mirrors and handle plastic restoration.

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## DEGREASE

The main aspect of cleaning that is essential is to remove grease. Grease will act as a protective barrier. No Undercoat, prep or adhesion aid needed. On many plastics we recommend a very gentle sanding, but with 'old' faded bumpers this isn't needed.

## SHAKE... A LOT

Your cans of Vinyl Dye from [www.VinylDye.co.uk](http://www.VinylDye.co.uk) may have come from around the world, but they were well rested along the way. Get those chemicals well and truly mixed up. First shake 5 mins minimum, then little swirls in between layers.

## SPOT TEST

We always recommend a spot test for every project. It proves a few things in one go. A) you're happy with the colour. B) for many it's the first time you've sprayed for a while, so get a little practice in, and finally C) you can check the Vinyl Dye is performing to your needs, as there are so many 1000's of types of plastics, on very rare occasions it may fail to bond to yours.

## MASK

Any masking tape will do, you will achieve a very clean line, Vinyl Dye will not 'seep' underneath the tape. Use newspaper to cover larger areas with the tape. Leave for 8 to 24 hours after you've finished spraying before you remove tape.

## SPRAY

Your aim is to 'spray spots on a leopard' and build it up to a complete coat. You should not under any circumstances aim to cover your bumper with just one coat. Instead you spray a 'mist' layer, then leave to dry for 10-15 minutes. Then repeat. It should take at least 3 if not 5 mist layers to complete into one full coat and restore the bumper.

Start spraying just before your bumper and stay spraying just after it, this way you'll have a truly even spray even at the ends.
