Top 5 Mistakes Made with Vinyl Dye Sprays

We've spoken to 1000's of customers over the 7 years we've been running VinylDye.co.uk and while there could be a huge list of Don'ts, all of the below have been experienced by someone and it's really set them back.

1. Don't forget to spot test an inconspicuous area to completion prior to undergoing the entire project.
2. Don't use White Spirit to clean your item. White Spirit is an oil and as such won't evaporate and will stay on your item. It will act as a truly fantastic barrier and prevent the dye getting to the material.
3. Don't use Decorators Soap Crystals. I know this sounds strange, and hey it is. But as far as we know, anyone who has used this has phoned us up asking for help. So please, just don't use them, they have ruined many a project.
4. Don't pull off any masking tape until at least 8 to 24 hours has passed to let the dye truly dry. Sounds simple, and you'll figure this out pretty quick, but hey, why not learn from others.
5. Don't spray in extreme temperatures. Ideally, you'll be applying your spray at room temperature or at about 15 to 24 Celsius. That's between 59 and 75 Fahrenheit for those schooled prior to the 80's. This does mean not spraying items in direct sunlight too, when doing vehicles, yes take this seriously, yes actually do one side then the other at different times of day as the sun moves around in the summer!

I know I said 5, but honestly, this one needed repeating, it's in the instructions, it's on the can, but you know, just in case you missed it...

6. Don't ignore the bit about shaking the can! It's not difficult, you can pick 2-3 cans up in your hands and do several at once.
